Professor Michael A. Olivas. The Rock and Roll Law Professor(SM) has a regular syndicated radio show on National Public Radio, *The Law of Rock and Roll*, where he reviews legal developments in music and entertainment law. He also lectures on entertainment law subjects to lawyers and trade groups. He is the William B. Bates Distinguished Chair in Law at the University of Houston Law Center and Director of the Institute for Higher Education Law and Governance at UH. Professor Olivas has authored or co-authored fifteen books and written hundreds of legal articles. He is also a Past President of the Association of American Law Schools.

Professor Dave Fagundes. Professor Fagundes writes and teaches about copyright and property law. He previously worked at Southwestern Law School in Los Angeles, CA; as a Bigelow Fellow and Lecturer in Law at the University of Chicago Law School; an associate at the Washington, D.C. office of Jenner & Block, LLP; and a clerk to Judge David S. Tatel of the U.S. Court of Appeals for the D.C. Circuit. He has written numerous law review articles on copyright, including *The Moral Psychology of Copyright Infringement*, 100 Minn. L. Rev. 2433 (2016) (with Christopher Buccafusco)
